Observation:

- 1. Describe incidents or examples of general characteristics of four-year-olds and/or five-year-olds listed in the text that you observed.
 - The group of children were playing tag outside during free play. They hide behind objects, are running/chasing each other, climbing on things for safety, etc.

- 2. List the physical skills and motor behaviors the children demonstrated.
 - 1. Running is a gross motor skill
 - 2. Moving around; ducking, covering, squatting, jumping as well
 - 3. Fine motor skill using their hands to climb, tag others, holding hands
